

AP Psychology Syllabus

Welcome to AP Psychology! Psychology is the scientific study of human behavior and mental processes. We'll spend some time getting into our heads and exploring why and how we act the way we do.

Course Expectations:

Knowledge for application's sake: In AP Psychology there is a considerable amount of content you must master. You will be asked to apply this information to real life situations via class discussions or through concisely written free response questions (FRQs).

Psychologists read and do homework: As AP students, you will be expected to read the textbook and complete homework assignments. You must show evidence of daily preparation by participating in class discussions, asking critical questions, making text-to-world connections, and bringing in notes from your reading or taking notes in your personal copy of the text.

Note taking: The amount of material distributed in this course is higher than in a regular class. Each period you are expected to take notes on our class activities. I will provide all powerpoints/slides to you, so notes should be a way to clarify points discussed, not a repetition of what is already given. I suggest you print out powerpoints/slides before class and bring them to class.

Technology: We will use Google Classroom, Google Slides and Pear Deck for most lectures. We will use AP Classroom and Google Forms for most assignments and quizzes. The Google Classroom and AP Classroom codes are listed below. Should we need to use Google Meet, the code is listed on your Google Classroom page.

Attendance/Lateness: Attendance is mandatory and important. Lateness will not be tolerated. I will be calling home if you are consistently late or absent. You will be unable to keep up with the course if you miss class. Please provide a note if you are absent.
